On 3rd August, 10 farming couples graduated after the completion of their 6 months course at the Tutu Rural Training Center, Taveuni. The course endeavours to equip the farming couples with skills to make better use of their resources in the village to enhance their livelihoods. During the course they planted vegetables and sold it at the local market. The money were deposited into their own bank account. Their beautiful handicrafts displayed on that day would be sold for their upkeep as well. The Assistant Minister for Agriculture and Waterways, Tomasi Tunabuna was the Guest of Honour. In his speech he congratulated the participants and wish them well in utilizing their skills in the villages. He also expressed the gratitude of the Government of Fiji to Fr. Petero Matairatu, the Principal of Tutu and their dedicated staff in contributing to the economy of Fiji through skills offered and trained in Tutu. Fr. Petero acknowledged in his speech all stakeholders who have helped Tutu and in a special way Caritas New Zealand represented by the Director, Mrs. Filomena Antonio. He thank also the Government of Fiji for increasing its grant for Tutu from \$600,000 to 900,000. After taking the Assistant Minister for a long tour of the Tutu project it is hope that next year grant will reach the target. Besides Fr. Petero, the Marist community in Tutu consists of Frs. Makario, Isaia, Tomasi and Bro. Iosefo.
